## New and novel threats to watch

- · WTO dispute settlement mechanism at risk due to US obstruction
  - US blocks appointment of new judges at WTO: could lead to "crisis" paralysing the heart of WTO if left unresolved The Economist, FT
  - EU's Trade Commissioner Cecilia Malmström stated the Trump administration risked "killing the WTO from the inside" FI
- · Chinese industrial policy undermining free trade, having negative effects for Europe
  - Leading EU to adopt protectionist policies: anti-dumping laws and investment screening <u>The Diplomat</u>, <u>FT</u>, <u>Politico</u>
  - Chinese preference for bilateralism in Europe undermining WTO rules and EU unity <u>Global Policy Journal</u>
- · Consequences of US trade protectionism starting to materialise
  - US proposed sanctioning EU companies working with Russia: could divide EU between Atlanticist nations and others Carnegie Europe
  - First consequences being witnessed: UK affected by US tariffs on Canadian firm Bombardier, which partly operates in a UK plant FI
- · Growing resentment against free trade regarding perceived links with increasing inequality
  - Polarisation around WTO; Argentina banned activist NGOs attending summit despite WTO favouring these NGOs to attend FT
  - EU and member states need to address these concerns, as inequality deepens Reuters
